Update on Comrie Flood Defence Scheme

We have organised an information session with Martine Blake, project co-ordinator for the flood defences, here at the park office on Tuesday 2nd August, from 3 - 8pm. Please feel free to pop in during these times to have a look at plan drawings and chat with Martine. Like home and other business owners in Comrie, we have no choice but to facilitate all the necessary works to take place. We do feel strongly that this work will enhance the look of the park and will ensure we are well protected for the future.

Key facts:

- The new wall in front of Willow looking to the River Earn will be no higher than 90cm and will be finished in the style of a dry stone wall
- The bunding constructed in both the top and bottom field will vary between 50cm and 168cm. I attach a plan with the email. We believe there will be steps and a walkway on top of the bund for us to enjoy the views of the river
- All works will be enclosed with heras fencing , with screens where necessary
- Three new trees will be planted for every tree removed

The main construction for us will not begin until Jan / Feb 2023 but some preparatory works will be carried out towards the end of October 2022. These include:

- Small archaeological digs of 40cm around where the defences will be built
- Piping below the River Earn, from the former showground area to Lochay Drive in the village, to replace existing electrical poles impacted by the project
- Pile testing to ensure the ground is viable for the building work
