Comrie Flood Defences Project—Update

Earlier this month we met with staff from Perth & Kinross Council and the Project Lead for the Comrie Flood Defences Project.

The project is running to plan and contractors hope to start work beside the park in March 2023, to create the temporary bridge required across the River Lednock, which will facilitate access to the boulevard area of the village by the River Earn. Once this is completed, we will not be directly affected again until the second half of 2024, when work on our flood defences starts. They hope to be completely finished by the end of 2024.
